### FOUR PILLARS OF PROCEDURAL JUSTICE

The ultimate goal of the community workshop is to lay the foundation for building mutual trust, enhancing the community's perspective of police legitimacy and lessening the "Us vs. Them" attitude that can exist between law enforcement and the communities they serve.
