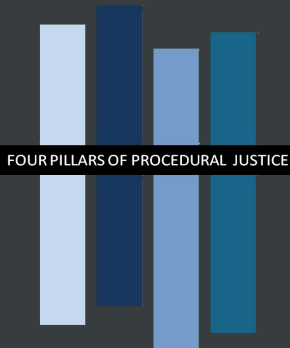




PROCEDURAL JUSTICE FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES: ***TRAINING OF TRAINERS (TOT)***

The Center for Public Safety and Justice (CPSJ) in collaboration with the *USDOJ Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office)* offers the strategic delivery of our COPS vetted and approved procedural justice training series. CPSJ has developed a three day *Training of Trainers* course to enhance the capacity of internal trainers in large law enforcement agencies with the ability to implement procedural justice throughout the entire department.

Agency trainers across the country will receive the skills necessary to train the following courses:



Procedural Justice for Law Enforcement: Organizational Change through Decision making and Policy. This course provides executive leadership, as well as sworn and civilian supervisors, with practical strategies for the internal application of procedural justice.

Procedural Justice for Law Enforcement: Front-line Officers builds upon the internal application of procedural justice through external interactions with the public by front-line officers.

This three day TOT course is instructed by a highly qualified two-person team, bringing the perspective of executive level law enforcement and an allied profession.

This *Training of Trainers* course is a tool for every department that will propel each agency's training and development to the next level for years to come.

Jurisdictional teams are highly recommended as CPSJ anticipates classes filling quickly.
